The common perception is that the pronunciation rules in Russian are rather strict. In reality, they are very complicated and have many exceptions. Pronunciation of Russian letters varies depending on whether they are stressed or unstressed (in case of vowels), and also on which consonants surround the letter. For example, the letter " " can be pronounced in five different ways!

Russian possesses five or six vowel phonemes. A number of linguists consider [] (rendered by letter) to be a separate phoneme, while some others maintain that it is an allophone of /i/ (rendered by). The latter interpretation is assumed in this article. Russian phonemes are subject to considerable allophony.

Russian is a phonetic language, which means that for the most part one Russian letter corresponds to one sound. The letter K is always pronounced like k, and the letter M is always pronounced like m. This pattern is different from English, where a letter can be pronounced in different ways depending on where it shows up in a word.
